

ABOUT IBL COMMISSIONER MIKAL DUILIO

Mikal Duilio, 38, has operated sports leagues and events for over 22 years. As a teenager from 1985 to 1992, Mikal Duilio founded and directed the Indianola Jamball League (lowa) featured on a CBS news station.

In 1992, Duilio obtained a Masters Degree in Public Administration from Iowa State University and moved to Portland Oregon where he founded, owned and directed PortlandBasketball.Com; for 13 years and running. PortlandBasketball.Com has been the world's largest basketball league running over 5,000 amateur basketball games per year.

In 2001, Duilio also founded PugetSoundBasketball.Com—the largest basketball league in the State of Washington. Duilio sold that business in April of 2003 to current owner Tim Kerns. In November of 2003, Duilio founded the International Basketball League.

Duilio founded the IBL in 2003 with the first IBL game occurring in April of 2005; opening night saw former NBA great Tim Hardaway score 50 points in a triple-overtime win over Waterloo, Iowa.
